Fresh, familiar

All elements of the existing logotype design are kept to maintain familiarity with the symbol, while individual elements are redrawn for a bolder look to freshen the IPPC brand and make it more consistent with other existing FAO/NSP marks.

3 Color

The redrawn IPPC logotype can follow the International Year of Plant Health color palette with tints that can be sampled for complementary use with the fully saturated colors in accompanying designs. The main color is “Warm Green” Pantone 7739c, with “Warm Black” Pantone Black 7c, or default Black for logo text.

4 Typography & Sizing

The typeface used for the IPPC letters in the logotype glyph is ***Helvetica Neue LT Bold Condensed Oblique***.



Do not distort, stretch, rotate, skew, recreate or alter the logotype, but feel free to use the glyph by itself and omit the text if the situation calls for it.

Stay above the following sizes to ensure legibility:




7 Usage Examples


Plant Health and Safe Trade



Key Facts

- The annual value of **trade** in agricultural products has **grown almost three-fold** over the past decade, largely in emerging economies and developing countries, reaching **USD 1.7 trillion**.
- Over USD 220 billion is **lost** each year in agricultural trade due to **plant pests**.
- To make safe trade, it is crucial to apply **international plant health standards** and norms developed by international experts in the IPPC community.

Increasing movement of people and goods around the world has increased the risks of **plant pests being introduced and established** in new areas. The most common pathway for plant pests is through **sea containers** which travel daily through multiple ports and international borders. Pests can be carried across various goods apart from plants including those in untreated **wood packaging**. E-commerce has also increased pest risk as goods traded online and delivered to homes may not always be certified free from pests.
