The International Plant Protection Convention (IPPC) is an **intergovernmental treaty** signed by 184 countries or contracting parties, whose goal is to protect the world's plant resources from invasive pests and to promote safe \boldsymbol{trade} of agricultural products. The $\boldsymbol{Convention}$ adopts and promotes the application of International Standards for Phytosanitary Measures (ISPMs) as the main set of tools to achieve its goals, making it the sole global standard setting organization for plant health. 🛹 Read more


